TDC NET is an open-access connectivity provider of digital infrastructure. We build, own and operate the next generation of Denmark's digital infrastructure.

Denmark has a leading position within digitalisation across the EU, and TDC NET plays an important role in enabling society's transition to a green and sustainable future.

We procure network equipment from manufacturers and sub-contractors e.g. mobile antennas and fiber cables

Core business

We build and maintain high-speed mobile network and fixed connections.

We sell, and provide service providers with, access to TDC NET's network.

Service providers sell network access and services to end users, who use the infrastructure provided by TDC NET.

We install and maintain infrastructure at end users.

Financial performance DKKm



Key highlights, H1 2023

Revenue decreased by 2.6% YoY to DKK 3,272m

- Development primarily driven by decrease in legacy product offerings, and mobility services. Mobility services was affected by lower billing on power prices, partly offset by increase in mobile contract and increase in revenue streams from internet and network due to shifts in RGU bases towards fibre

Opex improved by 12.1% YoY to DKK (806m)

- The development was driven by optimisations within opex from fewer fixed network faults in the network and higher productivity within the workforce. Lastly fewer FTE's and as well as reduced power costs has contributed to an improved opex

EBITDA increased by 1.0% YoY to DKK 2,340m

- EBITDA increased by DKK 25m to DKK 2,340m. This was attributable to decreasing operating expenses resulting in an improved EBITDA margin by 3.8% to 72% in H1 2023

Capex¹ increased by 1.0% YoY to DKK (1,469m)

- Continued investments in fibre rollout (additional ~47k homes passed in H1 2023) and mobile network – maintain investment levels in core business in H1 2023

Financial performance DKKm



Key highlights, H1 2023

Operating cash flow excluding interests increased DKK 34m YoY to DKK 2,118m

- The strong positive cash flow from operations is used for interests and investment activities

Net interest paid increased by DKK 337m to DKK (908m)

- Due to refinancing and replacement of term loan facilities with issuance of long-term bonds we have seen an increase of interest rates in H1 2023 compared with H1 2022
- Net interest paid is impacted by timing. P&L net interest DKK (672m) H1 2023, resulting in timing impact of payments approx. DKK (236m)

Investment activities excl. TDC Holding decreased by DKK 87m YoY to DKK (1,587m)

- Decrease driven by the finalisation of the 5G mobile network swap and the related payments, but continued high investments in fibre rollout

TDC Holding upstream loan issued in 2022 of DKK 2,045m

Financing activities decreased by DKK 4,745m YoY to DKK (1,027m)

- In H1 2023, cash flow from financing activities decreased by DKK 4,745m to DKK (1,027m), due to prefunding in 2022 and Euro Medium Term Note (EMTN) repayment in February 2023

Total cash flow decreased by DKK 2,916 YoY to DKK (1,404m)

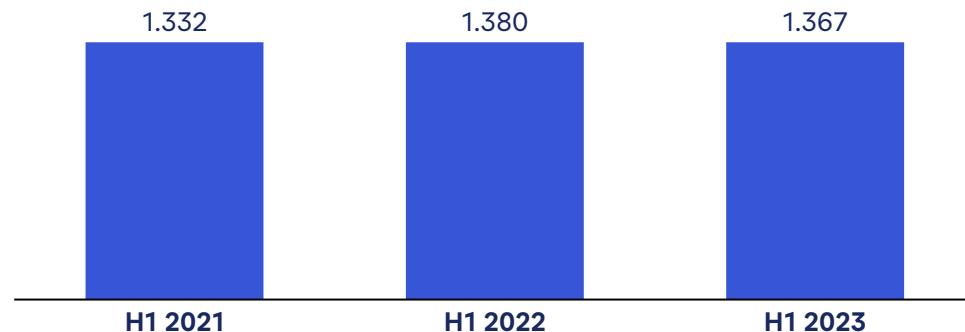
TDC NET provides Denmark's Best Mobile Network and leads 5G

Highlights & fundamentals

- Quality and speed among the best in the world
 - **Denmark's Best Mobile Network for the 8'th consecutive year¹**
 - 99% 4G and 5G geographic coverage in Denmark²
 - The 3G signal has been decommissioned nationwide in Denmark, allowing for improved 4G and 5G experiences
 - **TDC NET has in collaboration with Ericsson, achieved a new speed record of 7 Gbps** at Copenhagen Central Station, showcasing the power of our advanced 5G network
 - **Most satisfied customers** according to Telepristjek.dk on experience and speed
- Revenue streams from mobility services decreased 1% YoY to DKK 1,367m in 1st half of 2023
 - Pre-agreed **increase in fixed fee on mobile agreement with Nuuday**
 - Nuuday paid less for **energy** to mobile sites affecting revenue and decline in revenue from **national roaming**

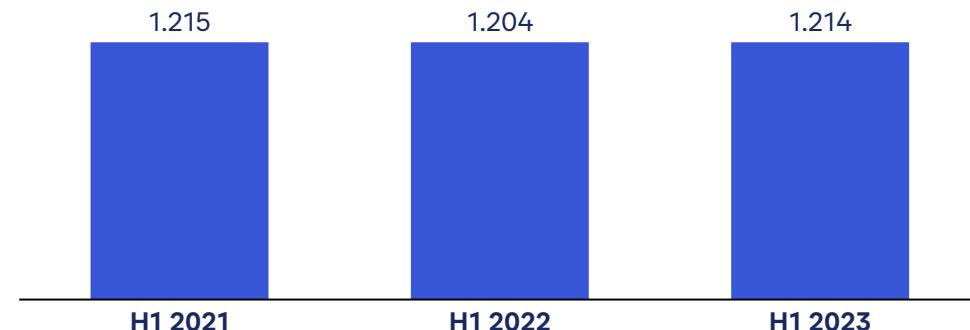
TDC NET's open access fixed network infrastructure in Denmark

Highlights & fundamentals¹

- **Largest broadband footprint in Denmark**, covering vast majority of Danish addresses with copper, coax or fibre
 - C. 1.9m homes passed by high-speed network (coax and fiber)
 - Additional **47k fibre homes passed** 2023H1 (now totaling 654k)
- TDC NET **operates an open access model enabling a diversified mix of 100+ service providers** to offer broadband to end customers
- **Revenue from internet and network increased by 0.9%**, or DKK 10m, to DKK 1.214m YoY 1st half of 2023
 - Increase in revenue due to slight **growth** in highspeed broadband and **ARPU increases** across all technologies
 - High-speed RGU's remained stable on 792k while low-speed RGU's decreased, positively impacting average ARPU. ARPU Fibre DKK 185, Coax DKK 89, Copper DKK 114
 - Positive trend in fibre activation due to higher demand from customer
 - In addition to ~47k new homes passed with fibre in H1 2023, TDC NET has connected an increasing number of homes in the same period

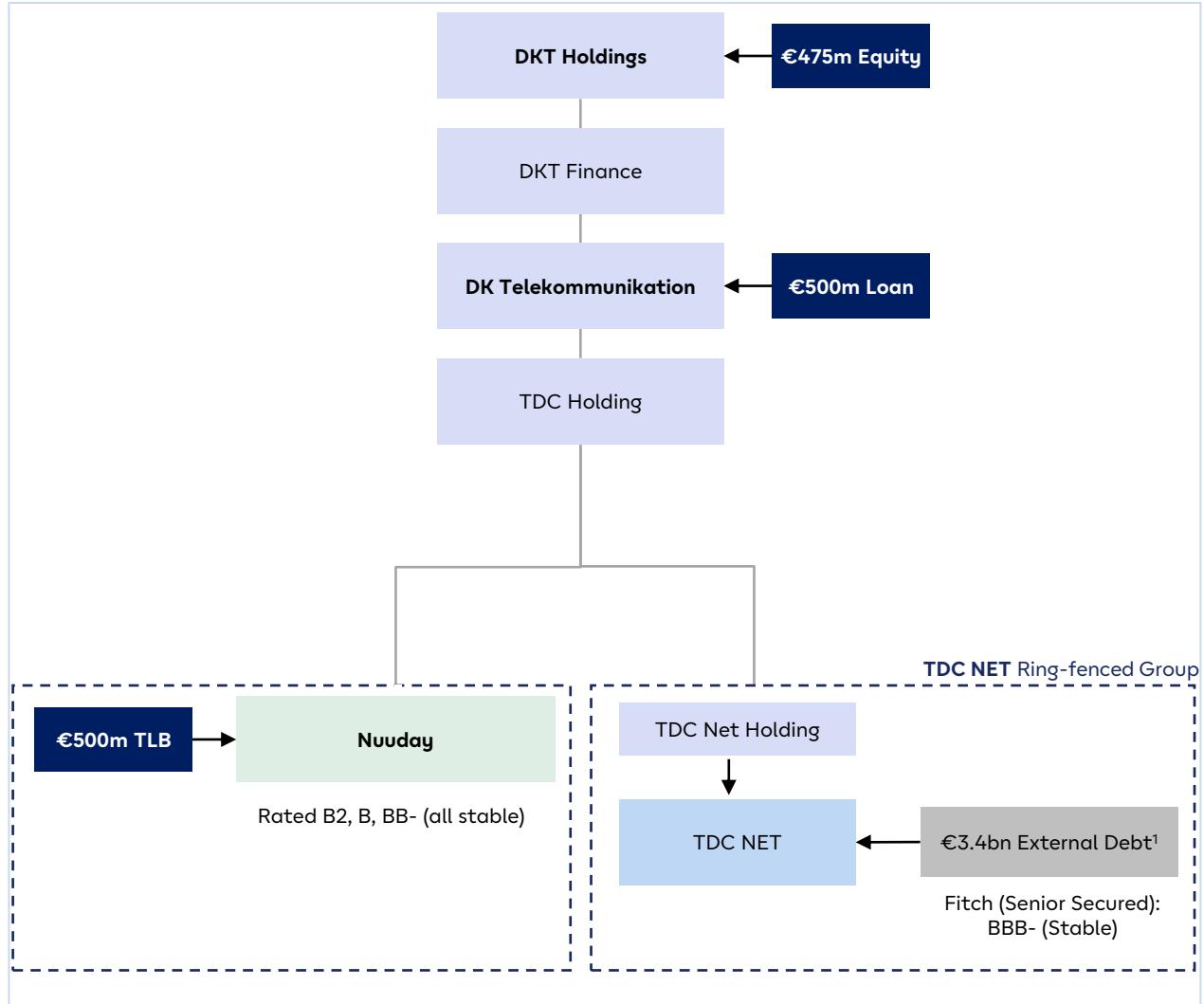

DKT Holdings: Stability for the group with limited refinancing risk

Refinancing at DKT Finance

- DKT Finance has redeemed EUR 1,050m and USD 410m bonds at DKT Finance ahead of their Jun 2023 maturity:
 - EUR 500m long term private credit facility** at DK Telekommunikation
 - EUR 500m 5 year new credit facility** at Nuuday
 - EUR 475m new equity** at DKT Holdings from existing shareholders

TDC NET funding: Long maturity profile

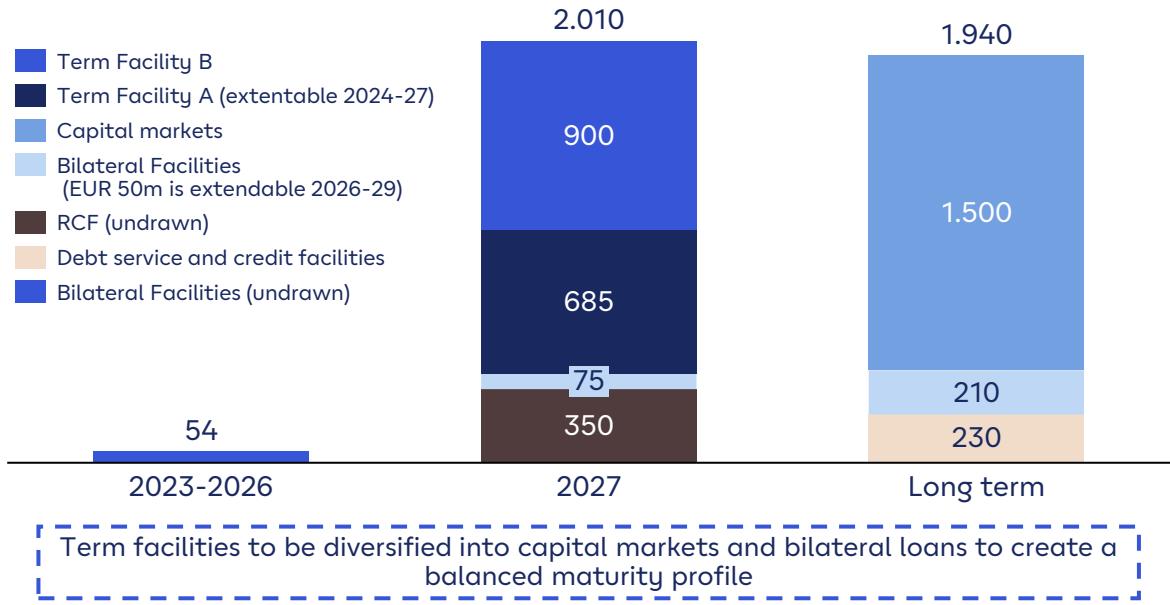
New Financing at TDC NET

- The funding strategy is to gradually replace the term facilities A and B, by issuing EUR 1-2b over 12-18-month period
- The funding strategy was frontloaded by issuing two Euro EMTN benchmark bonds in H1 2023 of total EUR 1bn and a bilateral loan equivalent of EUR 54m (undrawn)
- No immediate need for further bond issuance as term facility can be extended on TDC NET's discretion
- TDC NET will further explore and potentially diversify funding into Eurobonds, local bonds, private placements and bilateral loans

Debt maturity profile (30 June 2023) EURm equiv.



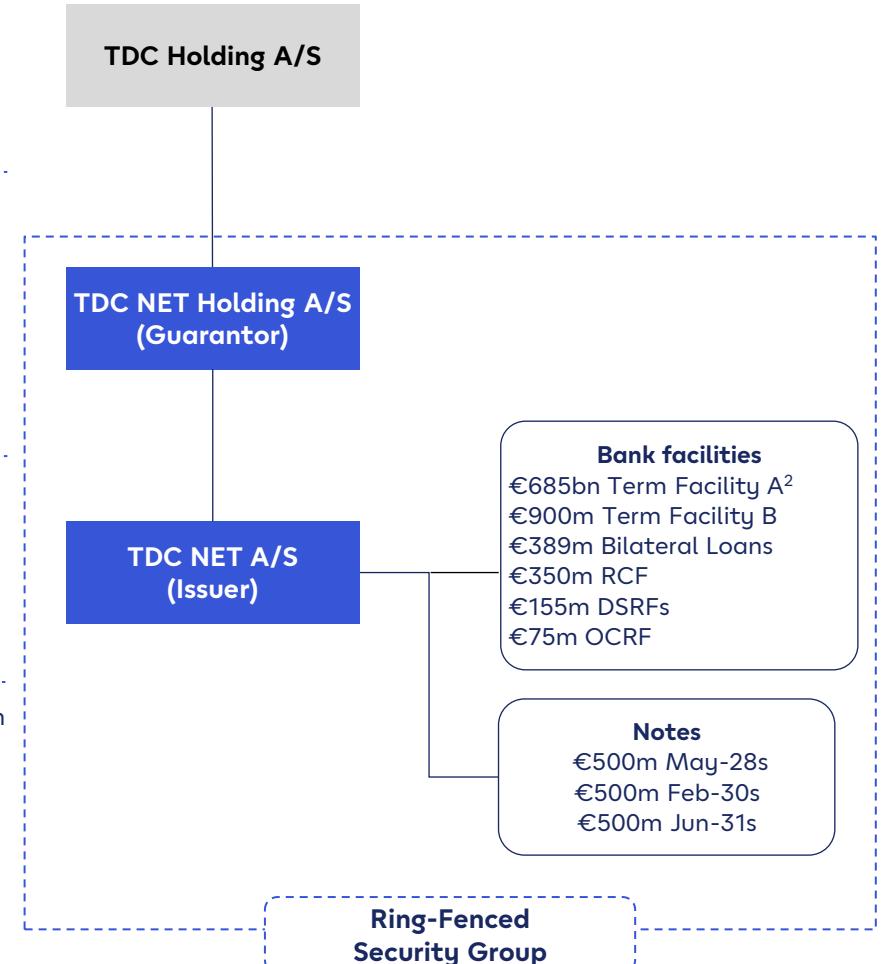

- The interest rate risk is fully hedged with fixed rate funding and interest rate swaps 5 years forward
- Leverage on DKT Holdings Group is 5.4x
